Why Eye donation

- More than 2 lakh corneal blind people are waiting for transplantations to get back their vision
- Approximately 20,000 people become corneally blind every year
- 1,00,000 transplantable corneas are required every year
- 60% of corneal blind people are below the age of 12
- 90% of corneal blind people are below the age of 45
- If one person donates, vision can be restored in two people

Who can donate Eyes

- All religions endorse Eye Donation
- Person of any age or sex can donate eyes
- People using spectacles, contact lenses and those who have undergone eye surgery can also donate
- Eyes can be pledged now and can be donated only after death with the consent of relatives

How can we donate Eyes

- Eyes must be removed within 4-6 hours after death
- Nearest eye bank should be informed immediately
- Eyes may be retrieved only by a trained doctor or a trained technician
- The eye bank team may remove eyes at the home of the deceased or at a hospital
- Eye removal process is simple and takes only 10 to 15 minutes
- Eye removal does not lead to any disfigurement as only the transparent section of the eyes called cornea is taken out and not the full eye ball


